District 1 – West, 5 – South West and 6 – Central West Candidate Statement

Candidates are asked to provide a statement outlining their strengths, achievements and professional contributions, which they believe qualify them for a position on Council.

As self-regulated professionals, Council members act in the public interest. Your Candidate Statement cannot promise/commit to changing CRPO By-laws, Regulations, Practice Standards, etc., and you should exercise care in advocating for or against established CRPO policy or practices. In addition, your statement should not promote or advocate for the self-interest of the profession. Finally, the statement must be self-contained; it cannot direct members to other sources of information.

Please proofread your statement thoroughly before submitting it along with the rest of the Nomination Package as it will be posted online **exactly as submitted**. You may provide a “head and shoulders” photo along with your statement. Electronic photographs should be in a high-resolution, .jpg format.
